Academic Calendar for 1985-86

I. Amendment to section 8.70.20 of the University Manual

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee recommends that the Faculty Senate amend section 8.70.20 by adding two new sentences at the end of the original paragraph (change is underlined):

8.70.20 The Academic Year. The beginning and ending dates of each semester shall be the same for all colleges and schools of the University. Exceptions may be granted to the College of Continuing Education. Requests for exceptions shall be received by the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee no later than October 1 of the preceding academic year.

Rationale: The committee believes that there are times when it may be appropriate to grant an exception to the College of Continuing Education and has recommended that section <u>8.70.20</u> be amended to permit such exceptions. The committee does not want to consider requests for exceptions in isolation and has recommended the October 1 deadline to enable them to review such requests as part of their consideration of the entire calendar.
