During the summer 1986 and at its meeting of September 22, 1986, the Curricular Affairs Committee considered the following matters now presented to the Faculty Senate.

ADD: FMT 200X The Aquatic Environment and Fisheries (I,3) The interrelationships between the freshwater and marine environments and the capture and culture fisheries. (Lec. 3) DeAlteris

SECTION II

Curricular Matters Which Require Confirmation by the Faculty Senate

A. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Department of Dental Hygiene

- a. DELETE: DHY 260 Advanced Preventive Dentistry (II,2)
- b. CHANGE: Credits and lecture hours for DHY 250 Dental Health Education and DHY 252 Community Health to "3."

2. Department of English

CHANGE: Level and number for ENG 200 to "ENG 300 (200) Literature into Film (I and II,3)."

B. College of Human Science and Services

1. Department of Human Development, Counseling and Family Studies

CHANGE: Credits for HCF 303 Nursery School Practicum to "3" and Method of instruction to "(Lec. 2, Lab. 3)."

2. Consumer Affairs Program

CHANGE: Requirements for B.S. in Consumer Affairs as follows:

The following courses are required of all students; some may be used to help fulfill the General Education requirements: SPE 101, 210, 215 or CMS 101. Students who took SPE 103 for General Education must still take a persuasive or public speaking course; ECN 125, 126; PSC 113, 422; MTH 109, 111 or 141; EST 408 or 409; EST 412, CNS 422, MKT 415, or JOR 436; PSY 113, SOC 100 or 102; SOC 204 or PSY 335; and PHL 117, JOR 110, PSC 368, MKT 321 or MGT 380; CNS 220, 320, 420; MKT 311; BSL 333, ECN 302 or 337; and a field experience (minimum of 3 credits of CNS 477, 478, MKT 491, 492, UYA 301 or 302).

C. College of Resource Development

1. Department of Fisheries, Aquaculture and Pathology

DELETE: The Two-year Associate Degree Program in Fisheries and Marine Technology (#260)

2. Department of Fisheries, Aquaculture and Pathology and Department of Animal and Veterinary Science

MERGE: Department of Fisheries, Aquaculture and Pathology and Department of Animal and Veterinary Science into a single Department of Fisheries, Animal and Veterinary Science
