SECTION I

Proposed Addition of Courses to the General Education Program

The University College and General Education Committee recommends approval of the assignment of the following courses into the General Education Program:

CLS 135 (or PHL 135) Modern Thought: Philosophy and Literature (I or II,3) into the <u>Letters (L) area</u>.

HPR 201 Honors Colloquium: Knowledge and Its Uses (I,3)* into the <u>Letters (L) area</u>.

LET 151 Topics in Letters (I or II,3) into the Letters (L) area.

WRT 301 Advanced Writing (I and II,3) into the <u>Communications</u>: Writing (Cw) area.

SECTION II

Extension for Revision to Section 3.21.21 of the University Manual

The University College and General Education Committee requests that the Faculty Faculty Senate grant an extension of time until the 1988-89 academic year for the UCGE Committee to recommend a modification to section 3,21,21 of the University Nanual in order to clarify "appropriate adjustments" for advising.

* Fall 1988

Rationale:

The University College and General Education Committee believes that the issue of "appropriate adjustment" for advising requires a thorough review of existing practices by various departments and colleges before the members can recommend a change in the University Manual. In addition, the UCGE Committee feels that it may be necessary to consider the entire paragraph before recommending any changes. Because there is not adequate time for a thorough review before the end of the current semester and because this matteris too important to rush into without adequate deliberation and consultation, the UCGE Committee requests that their report on 3,21,21 be postponed definitely until the 1988-89 academic year.
