

AMENDMENT TO SECTION 9.21.10 OF THE UNIVERSITY MANUAL

March, 1989

The Student Rights and Responsibilities Committee recommends that the Faculty Senate approve the addition of the following sentences to section 9.21.10 of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL:

If the accused student fails to respond to a charge letter within the required 72 hour period, s/he shall be deemed to have pleaded not guilty and scheduled for a hearing before an administrative officer other than the person who conducted the investigation. The administrative hearing shall follow the applicable procedures set forth for hearings before the University Board on Student Conduct.

Rationale:

The reason for this change -- and for its expeditious treatment -- is that there are a large number of cases of a minor nature in which students have repeatedly failed to respond to charge letters from the Office of Student Life. As there is no provision for this in the UNIVERSITY MANUAL, the OS� cannot proceed with these cases. They would in fact like to do so before the end of the academic year so as not to end the year with a large backlog of minor cases.
