On November 8, 1990, the Faculty Senate approved the following motion recommended by the Executive Committee in its Report on the Conflict between University of Rhode Island Affirmative Action Policy and Department of Defense Policy with Regard to Sexual Orientation:

That the Faculty Senate approve the inclusion in all University of Rhode Island publications which contain the University of Rhode Island's Affirmative Action and Nondiscrimination Statement the following disclaimer:

With regard to scholarships and commissioning into the armed forces, the ROTC Program, in accordance with Department of Defense Policy, does not comply with the University of Rhode Island Policy on nondiscrimination based on sexual orientation.
