ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE REPORT #1990-91-1

UNIVERSITY CALENDAR FOR 1992-93

I. BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

During the fall semester 1990, the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee considered a number of issues with regard to the University Calendar. Among those were requests to move the day of Commencement from the week-end before Memorial Day, to restore the 'state holidays eliminated from the 1990-91 calendar and to retain an advising day in place of Registration Day. In addition, the constraint that the fall calendar begin after Labor Day and end no later than December 23 had to be taken into account for a year when Labor Day falls on the latest possible date, September 7.

With regard to changing the date for Commencement, the committee consulted the Registrar's Advisory Committee and the Chairperson spoke to Vice Provost Rosie, Dean Morrison, Dr. Knott, Ms. Moore and AAUP President Swonger. He also wrote to President Eddy, Provost Gitlitz, and Vice Presidents Kenerson, McCray and Kennard inviting moment on the proposed change in Commencement date. All of the parties who responded expressed generally positive feelings regarding the change and believed that the pros outweighed the cons.

With regard to retaining holidays in the fall semester given the limited time between Labor Day and December 23, the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee decided to propose that the last two class days follow a week-end and that final examinations be scheduled on a Saturday. It was agreed that the Saturday and Sunday before the last two days of classes could serve as informal reading days for students. With regard to concern that final examinations on Saturday might pose a religious problem for some faculty members and/or students, it was agreed after consultation that accommodations could be made to handle this matter for individual faculty members and section <u>8.51.11</u> of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL makes provisions for students.

II. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee recommends that the Faculty Senate approve the following:

 That sections <u>8.70.22</u> and <u>8.70.23</u> of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL be waived for the 1992-93 academic year to allow for only one week-day reading day and final exams on Saturday, December 19.

8.70.22 A minimum of two week-day reading days will be scheduled after the last day of classes.

<u>8.70.23</u> A minimum of six days shall be scheduled for final examinations; eight days should be scheduled if the calendar permits. Saturdays and Sundays may not be used as final examination days.

 That section <u>8.70.21</u> of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL be amended to read as follows (change is underlined):

> <u>8.70.21</u> In the preparation of the calendar, <u>a</u> <u>fall semester advising day</u> shall be scheduled for the day after Labor Day. The spring semester shall have a minimum of 70 and a maximum of 75 class days excluding final examination week.

 Effective for the 1992-93 academic year, that section 8.70.40 of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL be amended to read as follows:

8.70.40 The Spring Semester. Commencement shall be held on the weekend immediately following the last due date for spring semester grades.

 That the proposed University Calendar for 1992-93 which appears on the following pages be approved.

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PROPOSED LEGISLATION NCAA CONVENTION

January 7-11, 1991 - Nashville, Tennessee

"The Reform Convention"

• We have selected for your review the proposed amendments to NCMA legislation that could have a dramatic effect upon the University of Rhode Island's athletic program or upon intercollegiate athletics in general.

No.5 SEPARATE VOTING-DIVISION I

Intent: To permit Division I-A and all other Division I members to vote separately regarding the maximum limitation on financial aid for individual student-athletes....

No.8 EXIT INTERVIEWS

Intent: To require Division I member institutions to conduct exit interviews with a sample of student-athletes following the expiration of their eligibility.

No.10 COACHING LIMITATIONS-IAA FOOTBALL

Intent: To establish new coaching categories to reduce the number of countable coaches that may be utilized in Division I-AA football.

11.6.3 There shall be a limit of seven head or assistant coaches and two restricted-earnings coaches that may be employed by the institution in the sport of football.

No.11 COACHING LIMITATIONS-SPORTS OTHER THAN FOOTBALL

Intent: To establish coaching categories and impose coaching limitations in all Division I sports other than football and reduce the number of countable coaches that may be utilized in Division I basketball.

No.12 ANNUAL COACHES CERTIFICATION

Intent: To specify that only those Division I coaches who have been certified on an innual basis may contact or evaluate prospective student-athletes of campus;

No.19 RECRUITING-TELEPHONE CALLS AND CONTACTS

Intent: To prohibit Division I from making telephone calls to or having off-campus contact with a prospect prior to July 1 following the completion of the prospect's junior year in high school, to limit telephone calls by a member institution to a prospect to one call per week, to prohibit students and student-athletes from making telephone calls for purposes of recruitment, and to prohibit telephone calls to a prospect during an institution's intercollegiate athletics contest.

No.22 CONTACTS AND EVALUATIONS

Intent: To redefine evaluation to include any visit to a prospect's educational institution and the observation of any practice or competition in which the prospect participates, to limit the number of evaluations during the academic year to four, to specify that staff members shall not visit a prospect's educational institution on more than one calendar day during the May evaluation period in the sport of football, to restrict member institutions to a limit of three off-campus recruiting contacts with a prospect at any site, and to allow institution of staff members to visit a prospect's educational institution on not more than one occasion during a particular week.

No.26 RECRUITING-NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT DEAD PERIODS

Intent: To establish a dead period beginning 48 hours before and ending 72 hours after 8 a.m. (a total of five days) on the initial date for signing the National Letter of Intent in all Division I sports.

No.32 RECRUITING MATERIALS

Intent: To prohibit Division I institutions from providing recruiting materials to a prospect until the beginning of the prospect's junior year in high school; to restrict institutions to producing only one publication per sport; to prohibit sending greeting cards, special postcards or highlight films to a prospect; in Division I only, to restrict printing on institutional stationery and press releases to one color of printing; to prohibit personalized recruiting videotapes or audio tapes, and to limit institutions to producing one generic all-sports recruiting videotape per year, with a maximum of three minutes related to each sport.

No.34 OFFICIAL VISIT-ACT OR SAT SCORE

Intent: To require a prospective student-athlete to present an ACT or SAT score (achieved on a national testing date under national testing conditions) prior to the receipt of an expense-paid visit.

No.35 OFFICIAL VISITS

Intent: To reduce from 85 to 70 the total number of paid visits that members of Division I-A and I-AA may provide prospective student-athletes annually in football and to reduce from 18 to 15 the total number of paid visits that a Division I institution may provide prospective student-athletes annually in basketball.

No.42 SEASONS OF COMPETITION

Intent: To permit a student-athlete to earn a fifth season of intercontegiate competition (in Division I, a fourth season for nonqualifiers and partial qualifiers) provided the student presents the specified academic credentials at the beginning of the fifth academic year following initial full-time enrollment.

No.44 PARTIAL-QUALIFIER AND NONQUALIFIER ELIGIBILITY

Intent: To permit nonqualifiers and partial qualifiers in Division I to team a fourth season of intercollegiate competition, provided they have completed 96 semester of 144 quarter units toward a specific baccalaureate degree program of the certifying institution by the beginning of the file academic year following their initial full-time collegiate enrollment.

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
