NUR 558X Advanced Gerontological Nursing I II,3 Study of age-related changes and health problems common to older adults. Uses biopsychosocial approach to analyze problems and develop nursing strategies within the context of organizational and societal influences. (Lec 3) Pre: NUR 501, 502, or permission of instructor. Burbank

NUR 559X Practicum in Advanced Gerontological Nursing I II,3 Study of major health-related problems of older clients through providing nursing care. Emphasis on developing, evaluating and revising theory-based interventions within the context of organizational and societal influences. (Lab 3) Pre: Previous or concurrent enrollment in NUR 558X. Burbank
