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

Curricular Matters Which Require Confirmation by the Faculty Senate.

A. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Department of Chemistry

CHANGE: Requirements for the B.S. degree in chemistry by replacing PHY 213, 285, 214, 286 with PHY 203, 273, 204, 274, 205, and 275.

2. Department of English

ADD: ENG 396 Literature of the Sea: The Rumowicz Seminar (I and II, 3) Poetry and prose of the sea. Guest lecturers and field trips. (Lec. 3) Schoonover

B. College of Business Administration

Department of Management

CHANGE: Requirement for Management and General Business Administration majors by replacing "must include" with "are encouraged to include" before the following: "Three to six credits of internship, a three-credit course in community service or another three credit course outside the department of Management that offers collaborative experience, a study abroad experience, or a minor."

DELETE: The following courses:

CHANGE: Description for PLS 478X by adding "May be repeated for a maximum of 3 credits."

ADD: CVE 466 Structural Concrete Laboratory (I and II, 1) Laboratory on structural concrete and construction technology involved in the materials aspects of the use of concrete. Cement properties, mix design, testing of fresh and hardened concrete, admixtures, reinforcement, concrete failure. (Lab. 3)
