At the April 6, 1998 meeting of the University College and General Education Committee, the following matters related to the current General Education Program were considered and are now presented to the Faculty Senate for confirmation.

SECTION I College of Arts and Sciences

The UCGE Committee recommends the approval of the following additions to the Current General Education Program proposed by the College of Arts and Sciences:

- A. That MIC 102, Exploring the Microbial World, be assigned into the <u>Natural Sciences (N) Area</u>.
- B. That GEG 101, World Geography, be assigned into the <u>Social</u> <u>Sciences (S) area</u>.

SECTION II Honors Program

The UCGE Committee recommends the approval of the assignment of general education credit to the following topics under Honors 119, Honors Course in Interdisciplinary Studies, proposed by the Honors Program:
