Section <u>8.22.40</u> of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL December 9, 1999

At the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee's meeting of December 2, 1999, the Committee reconsidered the proposed change to section <u>8.22.40</u> of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL that had been referred back by the Faculty Senate on May 9, 1999 (Senate Action #98-99--8).

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee now recommends that section <u>8.22.40</u> of the UNIVERSITY MANUAL be amended to read as follows (change is in *italics*):

Proposed Change

8.22.40 Distinction. Students who complete at least sixty (60) credits of their work at the University are eligible to graduate with honors. Grades in all courses attempted at the University shall be included in the calculation of the quality point average. On the recommendation of the student's dean, an exception may be made for students who have been readmitted but have not used any of the prior work to satisfy the degree requirements...

Existing Section

<u>8.22.40 Distinction.</u> Students who complete at least sixty (60) credits of their work at the University are eligible to graduate with honors. Grades in all courses attempted at the University shall be included in the calculation of the quality point average...

Background and Rationale

During the 1998-99 academic year, the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee received two separate requests with regard to section <u>8.22.40</u>. Both Senator Peter August and Ombud Vincent Rose proposed that Deans be permitted to make an exception for the rare outstanding student who could graduate with highest distinction if credits earned more than a decade before readmission were not included in the calculation of the quality point average.

The Academic Standards and Calendar Committee's earlier recommendation to add a sentence to permit limited flexibility to Deans for calculating qpa's in exceptional cases was referred back to committee. The recommendation to modify 8.22.40 was prompted by a student who was dismissed and several years later was readmitted to another program. This student achieved a cumulative grade point average that justified the award of summa cum laude in the new program but did not qualify because of grades received previously

at the University. Had the student been dismissed from another institution the prior work would not been a factor.

After reconsideration during the fall semester, the Academic Standards and Calendar Committee now recommends wording to address only those cases where the student used no prior work for the degree awarded. If any previous work is used the previous grades would be included in the calculation of the average.
