

SENATE:
REPORT NO. 1999-2000-5

At meeting No. 359 held January 28, 2000, the Graduate Council considered and approved the following curricular matters which are now submitted to the Faculty Senate for information or confirmation as indicated.

I. Matters Requiring Confirmation by Faculty Senate

A. College of Environmental and Life Science

1. Department of Fisheries, Aquaculture and Veterinary Science
 - a. Add (New):

ASP 930 Workshop in Aquaculture Topics for Teachers (*I, II or SS, 0-3*) Especially designed for teachers of science. Basic topics in aquaculture from an advanced or pedagogical perspective. *Pre: Teacher certification Staff*

B. College of Human Science and Services

1. Department of Physical Education
 - a. Change:

Change the name of the MS degree, the curriculum and the program from Physical Education to Physical Education and Exercise Science.

2. Department of Communicative Disorders
 - a. Change:

Add CMD 493 to the list of courses required for the MS in Speech-Language Pathology and the MS in Audiology

C. College of Engineering

1. Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering
 - a. Change:

Change section of program requirements for the Master's degree to read:

One credit of the department seminar (ELE 601 and/or 602) is required of all students. Up to two credits of seminar may be used towards the 30 credits master's requirement.

Change portion of program requirements for Ph.D. degree to read:

Two credits of the departmental seminar (ELE 601 and/or 602) are required of all students. These credits may not be counted as part of the 42 credits required beyond the Master's degree.
