



CHANGE: Title for FLM 101 to "Introduction to Film Media."

B. College of Human Science and Services

Department of Textiles, Fashion Merchandising and Design

**ADD: TMD 355X Draping for Apparel Patternmaking and Design (3)**

Application of draping techniques for apparel pattern making and design. Includes sloper development and draping in fashion. Creative laboratory processes from design to finished product. (Lec. 2, Lab 2) Pre: 335 or permission of instructor.

(Practicum). Pre: 60 credit hours with a minimum of 12 in WRT, 2.5 GPA, and permission of faculty advisor. May be repeated for a maximum of 6 credits. S/U only.
