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

At the November 19, 2012 meeting of the Curricular Affairs Committee the following matters were considered and are now presented to the Faculty Senate.

A. College of Engineering

Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering

- ✓ **CHANGE:** Description and prerequisite for CVE 205 as follows:

This course focuses on field measurement using conventional survey techniques and the implementation of computer aided design for the preparation of mapping and base site plans. Pre: EGR 106 and MTH 142.

B. College of Human Science and Services

Department of Kinesiology

- a. **CHANGE:** Prerequisites for the following courses:

- ✓ 1) KIN 310 to "Pre: admission to the teacher education program and PSY 113; or permission of instructor."
- ✓ 2) KIN 314 to "Pre: Concurrent enrollment in 315, admission to the teacher education program."
- ✓ 3) KIN 315 to "Pre: Concurrent enrollment in 314, admission to the teacher education program."
- ✓ 4) KIN 368 to "Pre: completion of math general education requirement."

- b. **CHANGE** Description for the following courses:

- ✓ 1) KIN 325 to "Physical fitness assessments with focus on appropriate test selection and performance. Emphasis on exercise prescription and the practical skills of test administration. Preparation for ACSM-HFS certification."
