Hi David,

Joanna and I have a plan for spending the one-time money the Provost wants to give us this year in lieu of the monograph increase for FY15 that we asked for in our budget.

We want to buy e-books. Here are the details:

1) Harvard University Press e-books 2014

This is a package of 153 e-books published by Harvard University Press in 2014 with an emphasis in arts, humanities, and social sciences. It is a deal through LYRASIS negotiated on behalf of the ARL, which means the license terms for the package conform to the best possible standards that ARL requires. The list price is \$6,273; LYRASIS will receive a discount based on the number of libraries that sign up by May 30 (the more libraries, the greater the discount). [We can pay full price now for immediate access and receive a credit when the discount is finalized.]

2) Oxford University Press e-books 2014

This is a package of 1,171 e-books published by Oxford University Press in 2014. This is also a LYRASIS deal that conforms to the best-practice ARL license. There is a 25% discount off list price, which comes to about \$84 per book. Final price: \$98,369.

3) University of Chicago e-books 2014

This is a package of 173 e-books published by the University of Chicago in 2014. This is also a LYRASIS deal that conforms to the best-practice ARL license. There is a 25% discount off list price, which comes to about \$102 per book. Final price: \$17,640.

4) Yale University Press e-books 2014

This is a package of 63 e-books published by Yale University Press in 2014. This is also a LYRASIS deal that conforms to the best-practice ARL license. There is a 25% discount off list price, which comes to about \$56 per book. Final price: \$3,516.

Note that all of these e-book packages provide the content on an "ownership" model -- we pay once for the books and they are ours forever. They are delivered at the chapter level via PDFs that are downloadable and savable, with no limits on number of simultaneous users and no DRM (digital rights management) restrictions on downloading, printing, saving, etc.
